Welcome to 3rd research symposium organized by The Instant Urbanism Network. This Instant Urbanism symposium takes place at Utzon Center, Aalborg University. The subject is Site Writing and Critical Spatial Practice.

This Symposium takes outset in the fact, that temporary art and architecture play a significant role in urban planning and development today. Artists and architects are enrolled in economic rationales, which essentially can be about creating good investment possibilities in an insecure time for urban development projects. This development is often contradictory to the historic roots of Instant Urbanism.

More than 40 years of critical artistic and curatorial practice have paved the way into urban space and explored a critical dialogue and reflection in the intersection between art and performative architecture. Art and architectural projects have presented artistic interventions on sites in order to promote social interaction, create autonomous meetings and add greater diversity in terms of spaces and experiments in the urban landscape.

This double bound agenda on temporary urban art and architecture projects raises questions on how we as artists, architects and scientists can navigate in this field?

The symposium discuss how instant urbanism practice can reflect critically on sitespecific rationales and discourses through an artistic, curatorial, architectural design practice.

The keynote speakers from England and Denmark will present their papers related to the following themes:

- Temporary projects as critical spatial practice
- Site-Writing
- Curatorial Methodology in urban settings
- Arts Curating as a public strategy through performativity, arts and temporary architecture.

After the one-day symposium there will be a two-day PhD. workshop focused on Site-Writing.

Welcome to PhD Course Instant Urbanism at Utzon Center, Aalborg University.

Welcome to PhD Course Instant Urbanism at Utzon Center, Aalborg University. This PhD course is planned as a combination of the symposium Site Writing and Critical Spatial Practice - with keynote speakers from England and Denmark – and a PhD Workshop with a focus on Site writing in theory and practice. The PhD Workshop has its point of departure in the results from the symposium.

On one hand, temporal art and architecture play a significant role in city planning and urban development, where artists and architects are enrolled in an economic rationale, which, essentially, is about creating good investment possibilities in an insecure time for urban development projects. On the other hand, this is somehow contradictory to the historic roots of Instant Urbanism. More than 40 years of critical artistic and curatorial practice have found their way into urban space and used it to start critical dialogue and reflection in the intersection between relational art and performative architecture. Relational art and architectural projects have provided projects where artistic interventions or works have been introduced into a site in order to promote social interaction, create autonomous meeting places, and add greater diversity in terms of spaces and experiences into the urban landscape.

This double bound agenda on temporary urban art and architecture raise the question on how we as artists, architects and scientists can work in this new field? This course argue that Instant Urbanism research needs both to be 'critical' in relation to identifying 'problems' as well as to be 'innovative' in developing a 'curatorial and architectural design praxis'.

The symposium discusses how instant urbanism practice can reflect critically on sitespecific rationales and discourses through an artistic, curatorial, architectural design practice.

The keynote speakers from England and Denmark will present their papers related to the following themes:

After the one-day symposium there will be a two-day PhD workshop focused on Site Writing framing the concept "Critical Spatial Practice" in a broader artistic and academic context.

The PhD workshop will focus on Site Writing as a discursive practice related to mappings and artistic interventions. Site Writing is methodological, which enacts a new kind of art criticism, one which draws out its spatial qualities, aiming to put the sites of the critic's engagement with urban installations first. These include the sites — material, emotional, political and conceptual — of the artwork's construction, exhibition and documentation, as well as those remembered, dreamed and imagined by the artist, the critic, professional architects and planners as well as other viewers.
