Progress Indicators of Healthy Transition

- Feeling connected
- Interacting
- Being situated
- Developing confidence and coping

Nursing mission is facilitating healthy transitions

Outcome Indicators of Healthy Transition

- Subjective mastery, well-being
- Fluid integrative identities
- Well-being of relationships

Four transition types that could be single or multiple

- Developmental
- Situational
- Health/Illness
- Organisational

Knowledge about the meaning of theories in general - and here TRANSITIONS THEORY - has over time improved patient care and contributed to evidence-based nursing care. Transitions theory is suitable as framework in nursing research, education and practice; it has proved useful in different nursing contexts.

The International Nursing Research Network PRANSIT, established in 2009, and researching patients' and relatives' transfer from unit to unit and from hospital to home in reviews, is using Meleis' transitions theory as framework. PRANSIT's reviews concern neonatal, adolescent and intensive care thus contributing to evidence-based knowledge in these contexts.

The **PRANSIT** members are teaching transfer and transition issues in nursing nationally and internationally.
