Dear Dr Ydesen,

I am pleased to be able to tell you that you have been elected to an IASH-SSPS Visiting Research Fellowship from January to May 2016. The Fellowship is for research on your project 'Crafting Globalization – A historical inquiry into the global role and impact of the OECD in the field of education, 1961-2016' and to enable you to work with Dr Sotiria Grek in the School of Social and Political Science at the University of Edinburgh.

We are able to offer you the sum of £3,000 as a contribution to your travel and accommodation costs. Please note that this is a bursary, not a stipend, and does not carry tax, pension or national insurance implications.

You will have a private office in the Institute for Advanced Studies in the Humanities available to you at all times. Each office has a computer and all the usual office facilities. You will also have full borrowing rights at Edinburgh University Library.

As a Fellow you will be expected to play a full part in the activities of the Institute. This includes participating in the weekly Institute Work-in-Progress seminars as well as attending the weekly Fellows' lunch. The Institute also runs a full programme of events throughout the year in which you will be very welcome to participate. During the course of your stay in Edinburgh, you will be required to make two seminar presentations on your research – one at IASH and one in SSPS – and to take part in relevant seminars in both IASH and SSPS.


Please note that all Fellows of the Institute are expected to abide by the Code of Research Ethics of the University of Edinburgh's College of Humanities and Social Science. Details of the code can be found at the following website: <http://tinyurl.com/ResearchEthics1>

We should be grateful if you would send us in the mail an original passport-sized colour photograph of yourself against a white background so that we can arrange your University Visitor Card in advance of your arrival. You should ensure the photograph arrives one month before the commencement of your Fellowship. Photographs should be addressed to The Secretary.

I should point out that reciprocal health care agreements exist between the UK and a number of other countries, but that they are limited to treatment the need for which arose during the visit to the UK. Please check whether you are covered for health insurance purposes under a reciprocal arrangement between your Government and that of the UK. The personal property of members of the University is not insured by the University. You should check that your own insurance policies cover your belongings (computers, books, clothing etc.) and those of anyone accompanying you whilst you are in the UK.

I do hope that you will be able to accept the fellowship and look forward to receiving your formal acceptance in writing.
