Music therapy is a subject area that is constantly developing and a subject that offers a clear connection between theory, practice and research.

In my teaching, I am concerned with how I can translate knowledge about the brain, the nervous system, the body, music and learning intersubjective processes into teaching and supervision that is flexible, inspiring, dialogical, sensual, emotional, motivating, well-regulated and at the same time challenging.

As a former student in my subject, and by virtue of the teamwork on the course, I have received a master's apprentice training in teaching a wide range of music therapy subjects, and in taking on the position of PhD supervisor - which provides a good ballast.

My colleagues and I are in constant development and follow-up on evaluations, in an attempt to provide as good and upto-date teaching as possible within the given framework.

Inspired by my colleague Ulla Holck, I have worked with cluster supervision (several project groups participate and listen to each other's supervision) and think it has produced some good synergy effects among the students and is effective in many ways.

Corona time: online teaching will probably never be my favourite since the lack of physical presence and the time delay make it difficult to work with the nuances of human interaction - which are so incredibly important for musical and therapeutic interaction. But I appreciate the opportunities it provides in the form of easier access to knowledge and teaching internationally and locally.

I experience learning more and more as a relational project - and my vision for the coming years is to refine mutual

communication - to call forward knowledge rather than dose it - to create safe spaces for reflection and vulnerability in truly open dialogues. My work with adults from other professions at EVU challenges me to find ways to give theories, methods and tools related to music that they can use in their realities.

Guided Imagery and Music have gradually become a method with which I have a lot of experience and I would like to continue to investigate how immersive music listening and imaging can be conducive to creativity, regulation and inspiration for lessons, supervision and planning.
