1996 – 2012: Associate Professor at DTU. Responsible for more than 10 courses related to sustainable urban development, responsible for the development of several of them. Being part of developing the study program in urban and building design that became 'Architectural Engineering'. Supervising some 130 bachelor and master thesis projects. Educated as Pedagogical Supervisor at DTU, Learning Lab DTU, in 2008, supervising several assistant professors in the following years. Furthermore I supervised 5 ph.d. students and acted as opponent at several occasions.

My main focus in teaching is related to my research concerning the transition of cities towards sustainable cities. I am especially dealing with the interaction between citizens, urban spatial structures and technical infrastructures. Even though I am interested in all infrastructures, I must admit that I find problems related to sustainable mobility most interesting. Teaching is a challenge. It is not difficult to give a lecture, but it is a challenge to find the ways to do it that actually makes the students learn. It is about making the students think and reflect by using different ways of brainstorming, having small workshops, making the students present etc. I am eager to learn from colleagues and often get inspired by them and their teaching experiments.

Supervision is a challenge too: students are different, they have their personal styles in handling their projects, they have different ways of handling their writing process etc. As a supervisor, you have to learn how the specific student works and give her or him the best support in relation to that.
