I have been teaching since 1994 (tutorials at University of Hamburg) but mainly since 2010 at EPFL. My competencies lie in the fields of:

- Human Computer Interaction, especially modelling
- Interaction and UX Design, Quality of Experience
- Experimental Design
- Statistical and Physiological Data Analysis

I use a lot of flipped teaching with video lectures in combination with half or full-day workshops formats and/or studio time (in design courses).

I have supervised 23 Master theses (40 students), 7 BSc theses (31 students) and 67 semester projects (91 students, BSc 74, MSc 17) and been external examiner for three PhDs.

I'm coordinating the 7th semester in Medialogy and have been coordinating the 1st and 2nd semester of Medialogy at AAU Aalborg between 2013 and 2022, which typically entails managing the needs and schedules of more than a hundred students. I have contributed to the accreditation activities of Medialogy in 2014. I've been coordinating courses: Real-Time Interfaces and Interactions and Foundations in Medialogy (2013-2021).

I have a minor degree in adult education from the University of Hamburg and I passed the pedagogy course (adjunkt-pædagogikum) for assistant professors at AAU in 2013. I'm continuously updating my teaching proficiency by reading literature and engaging in peer exchanges.

I have co-authored a journal paper on teaching design and evaluation in a course tandem. I have taught extra-university courses for adults on computer science and given tutorials at the University of Hamburg on computer science theory on BSc level.

I have worked on the 2014 and 2020 revision of the AAU BSc Medialogy study plan. I was in charge of and/or contributed to three the courses I taught (Foundations in Medialogy) and three project modules (P0, P1 and P2, P7) for which I was the semester

coordinator (1st, 2nd, 7th). Together with a colleague I designed a new course 6th semester bachelor course on game design for the Medialogy education. At EPFL, I contributed to the curriculum plan for the equivalent of a minor degree of human computer interaction.

I have designed more than five MOOC courses at AAU for self-studying.

I'm continuously revising my course material and teaching approach based on student feedback. For the most part I reserve face time for feedback and hands-on work and delegate information transmission to videos and readings in flipped classrooms. In times of high competition and availability of pure course material and knowledge I understand my role as the mediator and coach to understand whether applying concepts in a given context makes sense and how to do so. For the most part, my teaching is based on a constructivist approach and walking students at the border of their zone of proximal development through questions.
